

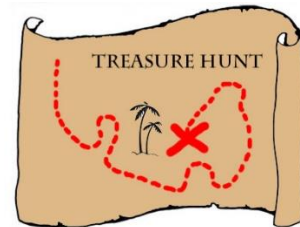
## Activities to develop vocabulary.

### Treasure Hunt

Design a treasure hunt, where you describe items rather than name them.

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| 1.Find an item that is bigger than.... |
| 2.Find an item that is round...        |
| 3.Find an item that can move...        |
| 4.Find an item that is soft.....       |

**Extension** - Ask for items using the word opposite.



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| 1.Find an item that is the opposite of big ...   |
| 2.Find an item that is the opposite of soft...   |
| 3.Find an item that is the opposite of bright... |
| 4.Find an item that is the opposite of fun....   |

### What am I?

Give your child a card with the name of a person, animal, object etc. Encourage your child to ask questions to determine what they are. Questions can only be answered with yes or no. Eg. Am I an animal? Am I big? Can I swim? Extension - limit the number of questions they can ask. Time them.



### Odd One Out

Gather a number of household items. Ask your child to choose the 'odd one out'. There may be no right or wrong answer, as long as your child can give an explanation for choosing the item as the 'odd one out.' If it is relevant, question their reasoning.

### Find the Item

Hide an item around the house and give 2 clues to help your child find them item. Eg "it is down low, it is near where we eat our dinner".

Demonstrate a number of times then encourage your child to hide the item and give the clues.
